# To the congregation members of St Paul's Church of Red Lian

We are Team Wrinkle – Wreaths Across America PA 0062 – In Memory of USMC Sgt Christopher M Wrinkle and MWD SSgt Tosca.

Our family became involved with the non-profit organization, Wreaths Across America (WAA) following the death of my son, USMC Sgt Christopher M Wrinkle and his military working dog, Tosca. They were killed in a barracks fire in Herat, Afghanistan on July 31, 2011. We were afraid that as time passed Christopher and Tosca's sacrifice would be forgotten. We needed to do something to honor his memory. For the past thirteen years we have been laying wreaths on the veterans' graves at Susquehanna Memorial Gardens. We have joined by local veteran groups, church organizations, scouting groups and other civic organizations in sponsoring and laying of these veterans' wreaths.

Last year's donations provided us with approximately 3,000 wreaths, not enough to cover all the veterans' graves in Susquehanna Memorial Gardens.

This year's goal is 5,000 wreaths so that we can cover Susquehanna Memorial Gardens and several of the surrounding local cemeteries within southern York County.

Would you consider partnering with us to remember all our veterans by sponsoring a wreath for a local veteran's grave? Does your church have a cemetery that your congregation would be interested in sponsoring? Ask me how your church or youth group could use this as a fundraiser.
