

Volunteer Opportunities for you.....

We are looking for someone to head the AMBA Blood Screening program this year at St. Paul's – this would require coordinating the program in April with Quest Diagnostics, lining up volunteers to help with the registrations, collecting the fee, getting refreshments for that day and seeing that the flyers provided by AMBA get out into the public's eye. AMBA handles the initial sign-ups for this event. *We need to let AMBA know soon if we have someone to spear-head this, or if we need to pass on it again this year.* Please let either Pastor Chris or the church office know if you would be willing to step into this role, or if you have further questions about what's involved.

Flower and Bulletin Sponsors—The sign-up register is in the church office on the desk if you want to reserve a date for 2025. A 2-set of altar vases is still just \$40.00 and bulletin sponsorship is \$25.00.

Ushers & Head Ushers, Greeters and Scripture Readers are needed for our worship service each week. Both ladies and gentlemen are welcome to participate and new faces are always welcome. There are sign-up sheets on the table at the rear of the sanctuary where you can sign up for any of these. Please consider helping out with these.
